If you did, you know Kenyon's Philander Chase Conservancy is celebrating 25 years of preserving the natural beauty and rural character surrounding the College. Since its founding in 2000, the Conservancy has protected over 6,000 acres of farmland, woodlands, and open space within five miles of Kenyon — ensuring future generations of students, alumni, and community members can continue to enjoy the landscapes that make Gambier so special.
