Previously, we had been able to obtain an estimate of this figure from the Ohio Board of Regents, which compiles data from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), and matching those without parents who had attended college with Student Choice Grant recipients, who were all the Ohio-resident full-time undergraduates at independent colleges.

Since the Choice Grant was repealed starting in the 2009-10 academic year, the Regents cannot generate this estimate for us any more. So we are asking you to provide this information to us. You campus financial aid director may be able to assist you in determining which of your undergraduates fall into this first-generation category.
